Following the guidelines below means you can help us protect nature while still enjoying Calke with your four-legged friends.

Paws for Thought

- We've got plenty of walks to explore with your dog - speak to a member of the team in the ticket office for recommendations and updates on where you might encounter livestock on the estate.
- Always pick up after your dog and use the dog waste bins provided.
 Extra waste bags can be picked up from the ticket office.
- Do not leave dogs in your car if you're making a quick stop for the loos we have dog tether spots in the stableyards for your convenience.

- Your dog can enjoy a cooling drink from the water bowls outside the café – a team member will happily refill these if they're getting low.
- Dogs are not permitted in the house and other stableyard buildings, except the ticket office and café. Registered assistance dogs are permitted in these areas.
- Not everybody loves dogs, so please stop yours from approaching other visitors unless they're clearly welcomed with open arms.


